Prepare for any event because your needs for most events will often times be the same.

Are you going to shelter in place or bug out?

You should be able to shelter in place in your home for a minimum of a week.

Survival Rule of 3's

- 3 minutes without air
- 3 hours without shelter
- 3 days without water
- 3 weeks without food

What do you need for a kit?

- Water, one gallon of water per person per day, for drinking and sanitation.
- Water Filter Life Straw.
- Food, enough supply of non-perishable food for your desired time frame
- Can opener for food (if kit contains canned food)
- Battery-powered radio and a NOAA Weather(Crank?) Radio with tone alert and extra batteries for both
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- First Aid kit with nitrile gloves
- Whistle to signal for help
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- N95 Masks
- Plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities

- Emergency reference materials such as a first aid book or a print out of the information on www.ready.gov
- Medicines (Mucinex, ibuprofen, vitamins)
- Mess kits, paper cups, plates and plastic utensils
- Paper towels
- Fire Extinguisher
- Matches in a waterproof container/Lighter
- Candles
- Paper, pencil
- Personal hygiene items including feminine supplies
- Disinfectant*
- Sanitizer
- Household chlorine bleach
- Important Documents, paper and USB
- Solar Blankets
- Books, games, cards, other activities for children.
- Special needs?

DON'T FORGET ME!!

- •Know the laws regarding pets and service animals in shelters
- Plan for an alternative safe location for your pets
- Prepare a disaster kit and carrier if applicable for your pet
- Make sure pets and service animals are properly identified
- Make copies of vaccination and shot history
- Keep recent photos of you and your pet with your plan and kit



Bugging Out?

- Reduced kit designed for 72 hours for each person/pet.
 Must be portable. Determined by transportation. Must be able to assemble quickly.
- Important documents and USB
- Have pre-planned evacuation routes.
- If possible, shut off utilities before leaving.
- Tell someone where you're going. Leave a note with contact info.
- Create a packing list so you won't forget essentials when it's time to load up, and pack as much as possible now.
- Involve children as an activity.

Kit Maintenance

- Practice
- Keep information updated on a regular basis
- Change items in your kits every 6 months
- Let your outside contact know where you keep your kit and what your plan is in the event of a disaster
- Include your neighbors in your plan


